On September 17th, 2019 we launched Worldhoppers Guild with a written piece of my own. *The Man Who Sold the World* is a personal piece and if you haven't, I hope you can take the time to read it. The buildup to this launch had been six months in the making and the response has far, far exceeded my expectations. Submissions come in with regular frequency and we are nearing in on 800 Facebook followers. As momentum continues to grow, we are in touch with more authors each day, earning more and more of your site visits - both returning and new -, and gaining more and more followers as each hour passes. We have several exciting updates right around the bend. By far the biggest addition that is on the horizon will be the Worldhoppers Guild Podcast. We are here to support, celebrate, and exhibit each other's works and provide a platform for marketing and networking. By helping us spread the word you will, in turn, be helping yourself.
